Principal's Report

-AP exams- are over on Friday, 697 exams were taken this year, theater department is getting ready to present plays for next year

-Approval of Upcoming Theater Performance Pieces-"The Crucible" and "Sylvia" typically the SCC will read it and give thoughts, they want to know if they are approved by May 26<sup>th</sup> (Sylvia will only be the first half of the play) Cindy and Michael will read Crucible; Brandon and Kim will read Sylvia

-Graduation Information: June 6, 2 pm at the Maverick Center Hadfield reminds parents that students leave without cap and gown so take pics before, and students parents and guests will have their personal items checked on entrance, Senior fines, deficiencies, ARCS are being taken care of, all ARCS are 2 for 1 morning and afternoon.

-New Brighton High principal introduction-Tom Sherwood— excited to come up and get to know people, taught here from 99-2004 his door is always open, prides himself on being accessible, strong student advocate, what is best for students guides him. Brighton works with RPT (trainers) and parents are worried about it not being around next year. Sherwood knows the founders of RPT, Sherwood was approached by the U who told him that he could have 3 trainers at the school everyday for free, the U provides a doctor and medic at every game and RPT couldn't do that but they could offer free physicals, it would still be more out of pocket for the school to go with RPT. Many principals saw the service and changed to the U once that happened RPT changed the terms of service. Sherwood will go over the terms and see what would be the best for the students. He has no interest in leaving as long as they are getting services. Strong Supporter of athletics and understands how it impacts them. Sherwood

is the region representative on UHSAA Transfer rule? Had a hearing to overturn it and it wasn't overturned so UHSAA is writing a rule to comply with USBE. Mila mentioned that ninth grade coming has a small class, this year's senior class is also small, the district as a whole is not growing, we are maintaining, the only growth is in the south end, we will probably end up at 2,100 next year.

Sherwood tries to have a net gain on permits, for Brighton permits out are 160 and in are 350.
