### **FACULTY REPORT:**

Brighton Music Department won many awards at Nationals. Dance and theater attended workshops and had a successful trip.

### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

TSSP and LANDTrust – any additional info

- Plan was submitted for approval on 4/11 and will go before the Board next Tuesday
- Allocated money for two conferences (Hive math instruction and PLC teacher collaboration)
- Schoolwide academic goal for next year will be structured classroom discussions. Micro-credentials teachers will be paid
- Technology focused on discussion
- Money allocated for PAWS, Reading (MLS mulit-lingual students), Reading class, class size reduction (FTE), counselor, math lab, hall monitors, teaching on Flex, ROAR program - PBIS

# Update on Construction

- Goal to have no contractors on site is 7/1/22
- Currently working on the exterior and landscaping
- Hoping to make some changes to the auditorium (move the sound booth to the back or move everything to the top booth)

## Cell Tower Fund update

- Plan for teacher applications for grants. Discuss this at the May meeting.
- Cell phone pouches
- FCCLA asked for Cell Tower funds 3 years ago and we gave each student \$750
  - If we are going to provide money from Cell Tower as a resource, we need to be more open about it and have a plan for groups to apply
  - There are many school organizations that go to Nationals that we don't give money to and students cover the cost with fees
  - We can cover registration fees with school funds

**Attendance Discussion** 

- High School principals met to discuss attendance
- Some want to bring back NG (no grades), but since the time we used them, the legislature has allowed parent excusals with no limit. This can be an equity issue as many students that struggle do not have involved parents that call to excuse absences.
- Discussion about motivating students to attend school and what motivates them (safe place, positive relationships, welcomed, etc.) However, many of our at-risk students are not motivated by this
- Tom commented that responsibility of student's success has shifted to the school instead of the families. How do we overcome that?
- Tom would like feedback from SCC on a new attendance policy

# Late Start/Early Out

- This is in discussion at the Board
- The same schedule for all school levels
- This is a transportation issue and in order to accommodate busing schedules, all schools need to be on the same schedule
- Friday early out will work best for this
- Friday is not an ideal time for teacher planning, but it works better for families (daycare, parents that work, part-time paras whose schedules depend on the early out schedule)
