FACULTY REPORT:

- Attendance is important, our schools didn't dip as low during the pandemic, Hadfield believes that students were in the classroom more. Attendance meetings are happening, but some parents aren't sure what to do. Summer—can GPA requirements be raised or attendance policies be adjusted for athlete participation. The logistics are complicated—who tracks it, who enforces it. Right now the coaches decide.
 - Tom will pull a list of kids who participate in extracurriculars and see how many are having attendance problems—he doesn't believe that many of those kids are having a problem.
 - Can we reward kids for attending? Yes.
 - Attendance cords have been discussed as a potential incentive
 - Data supports that the positive environments promote attendance more than punishing them.
 - Can something go out on Parent Square that reminds parents to be prepared for the parent teacher conference meeting—check to see what they are missing etc so they can make the most of the time.
 - We might be the only state that doesn't have truancy—the legislature wont revisit compulsory attendance for another 5 years
- **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**
 - a) **TSSP and LANDTrust--Vote and sign**
 - Book challenges-any parent can submit a petition to remove any book from the library. They can appeal that at the school level and at a district level. A parent in our community has appealed at the district level.
 - The following is the TSSP and Landtrust and is subject to change:
 - We are keeping our overarching goal except for a change from 2% to 1% to graduate. Many are not on track right now to graduate.
 - PAWS \$126,000
 - Multi Lingual student teacher 20,000
 - Literacy teacher 20,000
 - After school math Supports \$10,000
 - 2 additional FTE for core math \$150,000
 - One ALS specialist \$56,000
 - Paying teachers an hourly rate for additional time spent mentoring freshman during roar \$20,000
 - PLC conference Registration \$8,000
 - PLC Conference travel \$20,000
 - 1 additional FTE for class size reduction \$75,000
 - School Climate item 1—(PBIS committee) Baseline data for suicide referrals self harm reports 504 requests to measure progress of our ability to serve additional students with social emotional needs. \$106,000
 - School Climate 2 BHS will continue to provide increased surveillance of our problem areas particularly our restrooms to reduce the number of students vaping and vandalizing \$85,000
 - Social worker \$100,00
 - School Climate Committee \$6,000

- Two additional hall monitor \$85,000
 - Add a .25 counselor
- Thinking of adding pd, additional technology, student incentives, additional social emotional supports Tom Sherwood motions that we add these things if we have additional money to add to our plan Catherine Bates Seconds the motion.
