COUNSELOR'S REPORT:

- 1. The beginning of the year has gone extremely well. This year's Counseling Center's focus is happiness. The Counseling Center has determined that Brighton's student body has expressed concern over their ability to find happiness. The Counseling Center has created graphics to help students' mental health. They will add content to the Bengal News video announcements. The Counseling Center has also created posters to inform students how happiness is created (biological, situations, etc.)
- 2. Senior CCRs helps seniors understand graduation requirements and provided information for students as they transition to college.

- a. CCRs will be done mid November
- b. Summer Gallegos asked how will parents know about the CCR scheduled appointment. Currently a post card is mailed out to families. An email is also sent to families asking guardians to reschedule if there is a need. If a family does not receive a postcard, they might miss their scheduled CCR meeting.
 - i. The SCC is interested in receiving additional communication methods to receive this scheduled date.
 - 1. Please provide additional ideas to Paul Winkelman to take back to the Counseling Center
- 3. Counselors will be presenting into Geography classrooms to provide orientation to Brighton's online resources and clubs. The orientation focusses on keys to success, including attendance.
 - a. The counseling center is asking parents and guardians to sign up on the Skyward scheduler for their student's CCR. These meetings will be from October to December. The counseling center will schedule a CCR for students who have not yet had a scheduled meeting.
 - b. Other grade levels will take place in the new year, following the same process
- 4. Utah College week is at the end of October and beginning of November. This includes all public universities and colleges in the state of Utah. Staff members from each campus will come to Brighton to support students as they apply to colleges and scholarships.

PTSA INPUT:

- 1. Homecoming free face painting, selling hats at games
 - a. PTSA was not a part of the registration, so their member count is down and the budget is also suffering—we are at 20% of our typical PTSA budget for the 2023-2024 school year. Please encourage any and all community members to join PTSA.
 - i. Community members cannot sign up for the PTSA at school. Instead, members must sign up through member hub which is a state requirement.
 - ii. Staff members many staff members paid through the front office. The PTSA will transfer those funds and member lists to PTSA.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

- School Safety Update: Marielle provided talking points to the entire staff.
- The school motto and mission statement have been updated to better reflect our use of PLCs to better support student success.
 - Emily Nance is the chair of the PBIS committee on Brighton's staff.
 - Students will be given ROAR cards to better encourage student success. ROAR cards are then used at the ROAR store.
 - We will continue focusing on student attendance. We are looking for an equitable system to encourage better student attendance.
- Bell Schedule the school's bell schedule has been adjusted, moving lunch to fall after 3rd period to help students have fuel to pay attention in class. The movement of lunch is also an attempt to encourage students to stay on campus.
- FLEX has been renamed to APP (Academic Preparation Period) this follows the systems at other high schools. The time period has been shortened down to 30 minutes. APP is now attached to students' 2nd period teacher. 2nd trimester will have schedule

changes for students, but students will still have a foundational relationship with their 2nd period teacher through their 1st trimester schedule.
