<u>October 16, between 5:30 pm and 7:30 pm.</u> Student attendees can enter to win a \$500 scholarship drawing.



We look forward to seeing you! Filing the FAFSA is free and recommended for every Utah student.



Student's Preferred Names in the Yearbook

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Unless we are otherwise notified, your student's first and last name will appear in the yearbook as it appears in Skyward. This is regardless of if you have sent us this information in the past.

If your student has a preferred name that they would like to go by in this year's yearbook, their parent / guardian must email Taylor Anderson at taylor.anderson@canyonsdistrict.org with the following information:

Skyward name: the name of your student as it appears in skyward

Student Grade: (i.e. 9, 10, 11, or 12)

Preferred name: The name they would like to go by in the Yearbook.

This includes but is not limited to preferred names, nicknames, shortened versions of their name, or if they go by their middle name. We need to receive this by end-of-day **October 20th**!

APP Driver's ED for 2nd/3rd Trimester

Hello Parents/Guardians.

If your student is interested in taking Driver Education at Brighton this school year, please review the following information:

- Regular Driver Ed Offerings: The class is offered during 1st and 2nd periods throughout the year, as well as an online summer course.
- Additional Option: For students who cannot fit the class into their regular schedule, we are also offering Driver Ed during APP class in the 2nd and 3rd trimesters.

APP Driver Ed Schedule:

- 2nd Trimester: November 17th, 2025 February 26th, 2026 (57 days). Students must turn 16 before April 15th, 2026 to enroll.
- **3rd Trimester:** March 2nd, 2026 May 29th, 2026 (57 days). This option is for students turning **16 after April 15, 2026**.
- Students who turn 16 after August 1, 2025 cannot take the APP class and will need to register for Driver Ed during the summer or next school year.

Important Details:

- Space is limited and spots will be given on a first-come, first-served basis.
- To register for the APP Driver Ed class in 2nd or 3rd trimester, please complete this form:https://bit.ly/3ZpXsyy
- Students should have their learner permit before the first day of class.






BHS Lacrosse Blanket Fundraiser
