Get Involved

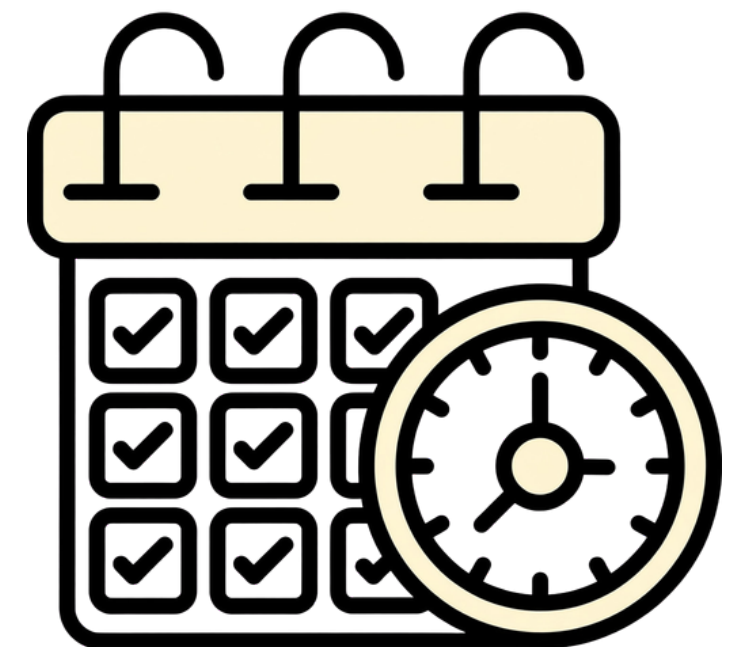
Brighton offers a variety of ways students can get involved:

Attendance Matters

- Students who attend school regularly, have been shown to achieve at higher levels, than students who do not have regular attendance
- By 9th Grade, attendance was shown to be a key factor correlated with high school graduation

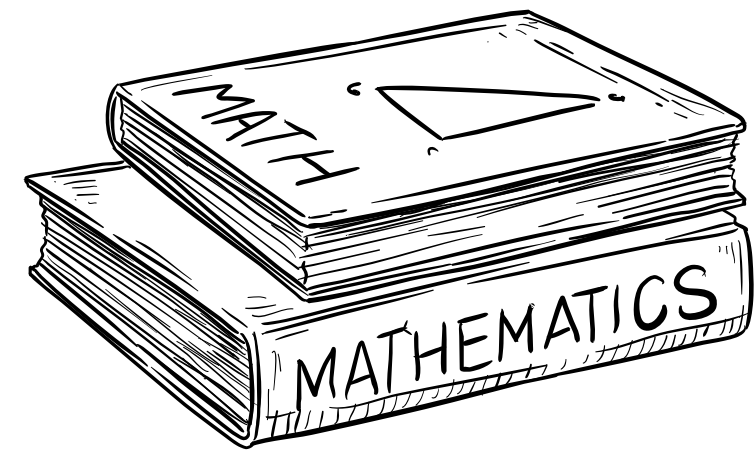


Academic Preparation Period

- APP is assigned to 2nd period (with some exceptions)
- **Monday** students are required to attend their assigned APP class – a Grade Check Assignment is completed which includes making an APP plan for the week
- **Tuesday-Thursday** students follow their Monday APP plan and attend different APP classes as needed

Math Tutoring

- Math Tutoring is available to all students.
- Held in various classrooms led by different teachers:

Practicing this skill early in life can help you stay motivated through school and to guide you in the direction you want to take in life.

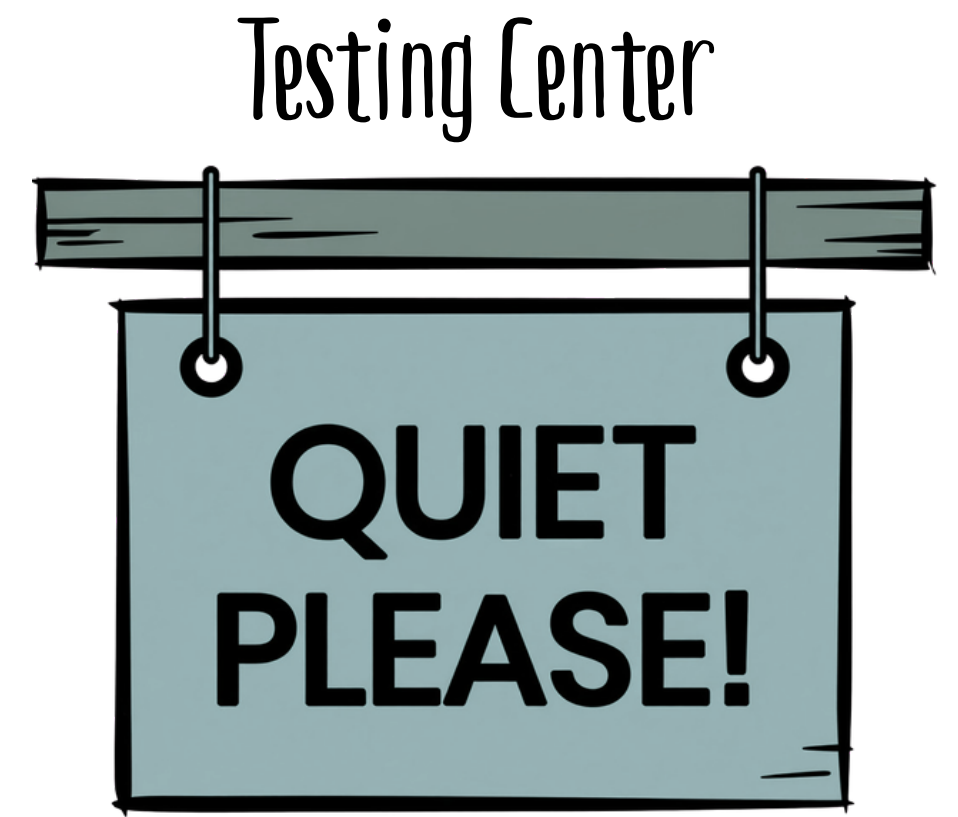
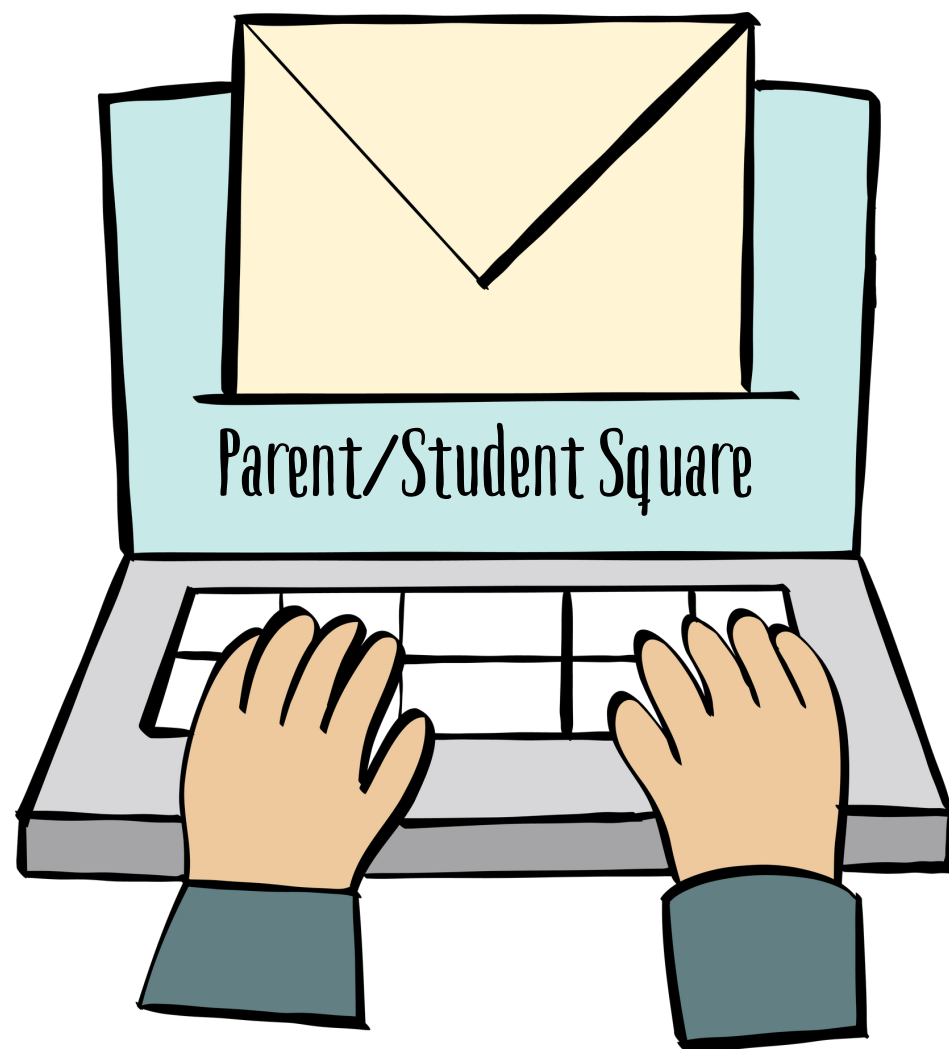

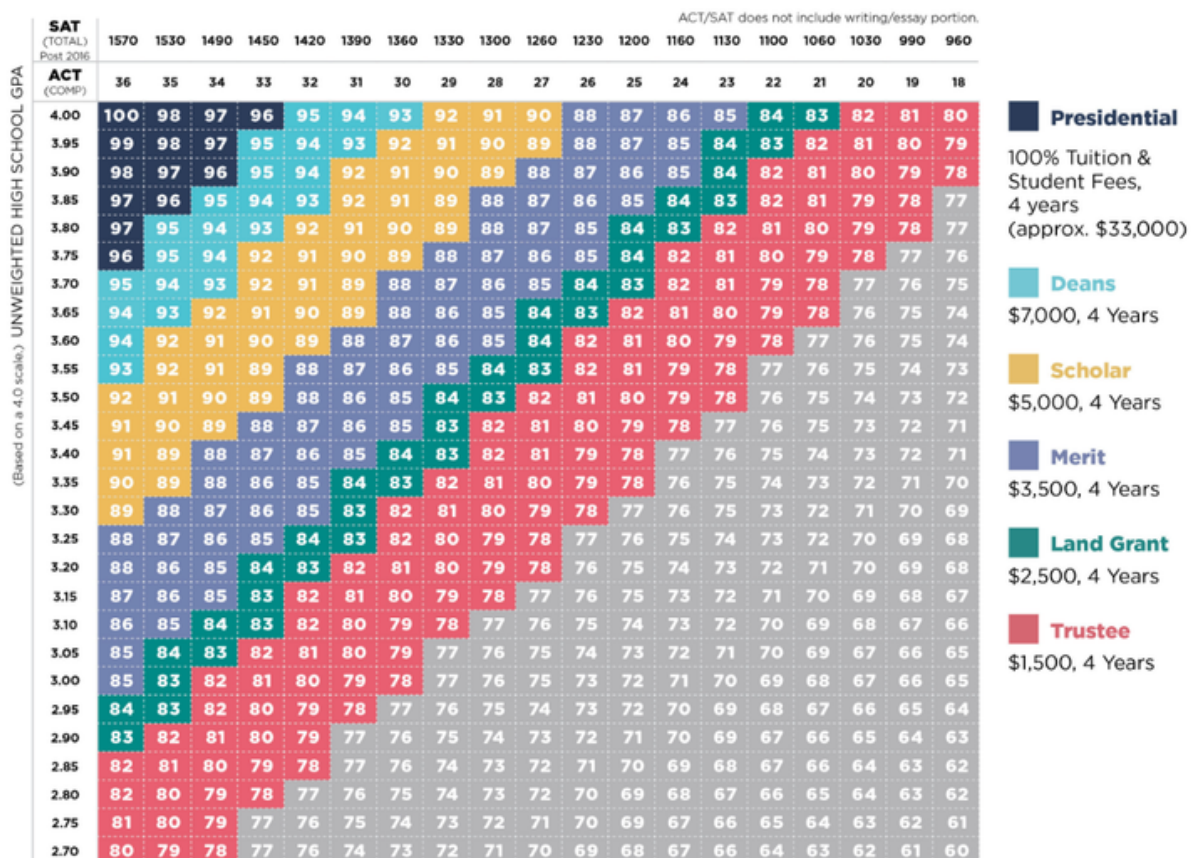

- Best score is used for scholarships requiring only one score
- Minimum 2.3 GPA required for scholarships awarded based upon ACT or SAT
- GPA scale is unweighted (4.00 is highest)

ACT and SAT scores DO NOT include the Writing sections of the exams.

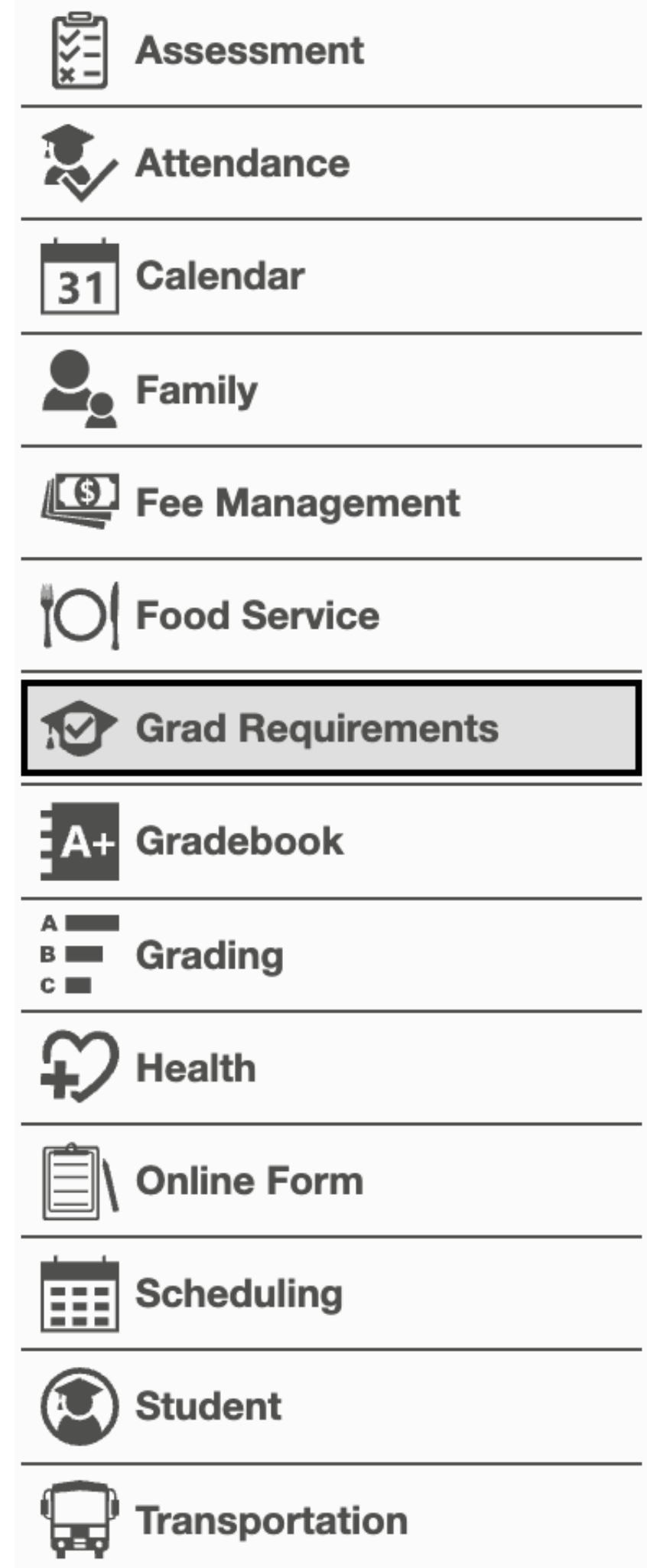
